


SCHOOL DEVELOPMENTS

At MCA, we are committed to providing the very best environment for our students. As part of this, we are pleased to announce two major projects that are set to open during Spring 2026.

The first is a dedicated transition building for Year 7 students. This has been designed to support students in the move from primary to secondary school. Students will be taught some of their lessons within this building and follow a bespoke curriculum, designed to build on the pillars of primary education, whilst also preparing students for ambitious work at Key Stage 3. By providing a base which will be exclusively dedicated to supporting Year 7 students, we know that our students will flourish and begin their MCA journey in the best way.

The second project is a state-of-the-art science block, featuring new science labs to complement our innovative science curriculum.

We are committed to providing our students with the very best resources to ensure that our curriculum can be delivered in the most successful way possible and we are looking forward to having both developments as part of our ever growing school.

WE ARE WITH YOU...

Moving from primary to secondary school is a landmark event in every young person's life. To make the transition between these two phases of education seamless, we ensure that your child already feels a part of the MCA family well before they start in year 7.

It is crucial to us that these relationships are forged before students start so that there are some friendly faces they will recognise when they arrive. Your child may have attended Urban Crew, clubs or our holiday camps so they are used to the building and how to navigate themselves in school.

We hope that in the summer term students can attend one of our transition weeks, where they will be welcomed into the Academy so that they feel confident with the step up to secondary education. During these weeks students will meet

their progress leaders and their future classmates whilst experiencing an exciting curriculum that gives them an insight into secondary school life.

If your child has additional needs or English as a second language they will be welcomed to the Academy before the transition weeks to meet key staff. Our future students and their families will have a longer transition programme supported by key workers that will be best placed to meet any additional needs.



WE CARE... WE ARE ABOUT YOU

Manchester Communication Academy works on the principle that every child can be successful by providing an exciting and challenging experience for all our students in a caring and supportive environment. Every student has a progress leader who is the main point of contact for the child and their families. The progress leaders will make regular contact with families and provide necessary support to ensure that your child is happy, healthy and on track to make the best possible progress. Students will also have regular contact with their head of year who will offer any additional support needed.

Every Monday, students have an Aspire lesson with their progress leader as they develop new skills needed to succeed at school and beyond. MCA has a child-centred and supportive Pastoral Team who offer care to students and families who may need a more personalised approach.

Family support

As a parent or carer of an MCA student we hope that you too will feel part of our MCA family. The Family Partnerships team is here to get to know you. We recognise that families can often be facing challenges that could impact on their child in school so it is important to us that we are here to listen and understand. We work closely with other organisations across Manchester to provide signposting and information for a wide range of issues including housing, immigration, training and finance.

Uniform

At our school, we take pride in our smart and practical uniform, which reflects our high standards and sense of community. We are pleased to support families by providing all Year 7 students with the following items free of charge: **School blazer, Year 7 tie, PE top**. These items will be issued via a voucher system, which can be redeemed at our designated uniform supplier. Parents and carers will be responsible for providing the remaining uniform items, as outlined below.

Full Uniform List

Blazer

Must be worn at all times during the school day unless a teacher gives permission to remove it.

Shirt or Blouse

Plain white with a collar. Shirts should be tucked in neatly at all times.

School Tie

Year 7 students wear a distinctive tie, which should be worn properly with the top button fastened.

Trousers or Skirt

Plain black tailored trousers or a black skirt. Stretchy materials such as lycra are not permitted.

Socks

Plain black socks only.

Shoes

Smart, plain black shoes suitable for school. Trainers, sports shoes or branded footwear are not allowed.

Bags

All students are required to have a backpack - any colour.

We believe our uniform is both smart and cost-effective, helping students to feel part of a focused and respectful learning environment.

School Rules

At MCA we have three school rules that encompass our vision and values. These are simple yet clear rules for all members of the MCA community allowing teachers to provide students with the education that they deserve. The three school rules are:

1. Put your learning first
2. Respect the building and everyone in it
3. Follow the instructions of the MCA staff team



ATTENDANCE

At MCA, we know that starting secondary school is a big step, and one of the best ways for children to settle in and succeed is through excellent attendance. We set a clear but supportive expectation of at least 97% attendance, because being in school every day makes a real difference. It means your child won't miss out on lessons, experiences, or opportunities to grow in confidence and independence.

Being on time is just as important as being present. Our school day begins at 8:20am, and we ask all students to be in school by then so they are ready to learn. Arriving punctually helps children start the day calmly, keeps lessons running smoothly, and teaches valuable life skills about organisation and responsibility. Even being a few minutes late can mean missing key learning or important notices, so we work closely with families to build good routines around the morning start.

Research shows a very clear link between attendance and GCSE outcomes. Students with 97% attendance or higher achieve the strongest results, while those with lower attendance often struggle to reach their full potential. For example:

Attendance	Days Missed	Weeks Missed	Likely Impact
97%	5 days	1 week	Excellent progress possible
95%	10 days	2 weeks	Progress starts to be affected
90%	20 days	4 weeks	One GCSE grade lower on average
85%	30 days	6 weeks	Serious risk of underachievement

We know that absence due to illness may sometimes be unavoidable, and we encourage open communication so we can support families if challenges arise. By working together on attendance and punctuality, we create a strong message for our students: that their education matters, that every day counts, and that they are capable of achieving great things at MCA and beyond.

GOING BEYOND

Beyond... the classroom

Outside of curriculum lessons, MCA has a vast offer of activities for students to engage in. After the school day students have an opportunity to participate in clubs including sport, cooking, engineering, textiles, art, reading, planting, mystery, board games, learning a new language, guitar, drumming, magazine club and many more. We have 112 clubs on offer for our students, of which they have to attend two a week. MCA's wide offer means that there is something for everyone.

Beyond... yourself

It is important that our students have a breadth of opportunities, knowledge and experiences that will develop a range of skills shaping them into valuable young men and women that will contribute to our society.

The Aspire curriculum is one vehicle that allows us to achieve this. We want students to express their views, step out of their comfort zones, challenge themselves and demonstrate resilience to overcome challenges they may face now and in life after MCA. We utilise a wide range of specialists both within and outside of the Academy to deliver this offer which includes students attending University visits and taking part in workshops.

Our Aspire curriculum is designed not only to develop their knowledge, but to develop a range of values. It is also important for us to ensure that we are a school that prioritises and enhances the health and wellbeing of all of our students. We strive to develop healthy minds and healthy bodies.

Beyond... your comfort

Students at MCA are offered the opportunity to complete a Duke of Edinburgh Award. This is a great opportunity for students to step out of their comfort zones and spend a year completing the Award. Students build on a range of skills that they would not necessarily gain in the classroom and get to use them at the end of the year when they complete an overnight camping expedition. Students say that they feel more confident, are more resilient, and gain a great sense of independence from completing the Award.

Beyond... Manchester


At MCA, we believe that a broad and rich education does not just happen within school. Instead, students should have the opportunities to explore the world beyond the classroom, enriching and consolidating their subject knowledge, but also developing cultural awareness and skills that will equip them for future life. Equally, we believe education should be enjoyable and memorable!

Through our trips offer we aim to create these unforgettable moments. In KS3, all students will have the opportunity to attend an overseas excursion with the global understanding faculty. This may be to France or Spain as part of the modern foreign languages curriculum where students will practise their language skills with native speakers and in real life situations as well as eating local food and exploring vibrant cities. Students in Year 7 will be invited to attend an Aspire outdoor pursuits excursion that allows them to build new friendships, challenge themselves with exciting physical activities, develop their team building skills and their confidence.

Throughout their time at MCA, students will be invited to attend a range of theatre trips, visits to galleries, and to attend high profile sports events. There are many more visits throughout the year that allow students to test their skills in real life contexts, making learning meaningful but also lots of fun! MCA is fully committed to ensuring all students have equal opportunities to experience these exciting and valuable off-site experiences and as such we aim to provide financial support so that all trips are accessible to all students.

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OUR MCA... IN OUR OWN WORDS

Here at MCA, we have 30 minutes of form time each day, where we receive regular messages, assemblies and key notices from our progress leader who look after us throughout the year. This is valuable time as you get to build a strong rapport with your progress leader and if you need to ever speak to a member of staff, they are there for you. During form time, you may also take part in a 'votes for schools' lesson where you get the opportunity to, as a group, discuss topical issues which are happening in our society and affect us the most. At the end of each lesson, we place a vote making sure that our voices on these important issues are heard.

Finally, we have 20 minutes of whole school 'reading time' each day. This is really important to every student at MCA as not only does it improve our vital reading skills, but it exposes us to a range of different texts. These texts have often encouraged us to read outside of our usual reading genres and this is incredibly satisfying as it broadens our horizons.

We always look forward to our health and wellbeing lessons, which are designed to help us to feel good about ourselves and unwind, they are always fun and engaging! Students rotate around different areas of this course such as PE, where we partake in physical exercise and get to participate in games which promote our leadership and team building skills. Cooking is another great subject within this scheme - we learn how to make healthy, inexpensive meals. Art and photography is great for creativity and expression. Finally, dance helps us to let go of any stresses and lets our bodies move freely.

STARTING SECONDARY SCHOOL: WHAT TO EXPECT

Starting secondary school can feel daunting- there are lots of changes all at once, and it's completely normal to feel a bit overwhelmed. Many of our new Year 7 students tell us that the things they worry about most are understanding their timetable and finding their way around the building.

To help ease those worries, we've shared a typical day from one of our Year 7 students. It gives a real insight into what life is like at our school and shows how quickly new students settle in, make friends, and get involved in all the exciting opportunities on offer.

Day in the Life

Starting secondary school felt a bit scary at first-I wasn't sure what to expect. But now, I really enjoy it and there are loads of great opportunities to get involved in.

I arrive at school at 8:15am, in time for Progress Time. I show my pencil case as I walk into school so that my teachers know I'm ready for the day.

Progress Time is a bit different, depending on the day-sometimes we go to assembly, other times we do activities, hear notices, celebrate achievements or find out about exciting House events. It's a nice way to settle in before lessons start. After that, it's straight into Lesson 1 and 2. My favourite lessons are Maths and RE-I like how we get to explore big ideas and ask lots of questions.

Before I started at MCA, I was really nervous about getting lost, on the way to lessons. One thing that really helps is the big timetables on the canteen wall-so even if I forget where I'm meant to be, I can always check and find my way. Then it's break time. I see my friends, have a snack, and get some fresh air before heading back in for Lesson 3 and 4. Lunchtime is brilliant-there's loads of choice in the canteen. You can grab something from the subway bar, go for a hot meal, pick up a cookie or fresh fruit. There's something for everyone.

After lunch, we have reading time and then Lesson 5, and then it's time for ESA (Extended School Activities). This half term, I'm in Cooking Club, which I absolutely love. We've made all sorts-from hot dishes to cupcakes-and it's a great way to learn new skills and have fun with friends.

Looking back, I was definitely nervous before I started. But everyone at MCA has been really helpful, and it didn't take long to feel part of the school. There are so many great opportunities to try new things, meet new people and get involved.

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LEADERS OF TOMORROW

MCA's student leadership programme is a great opportunity for our young people to develop the necessary skills to be tomorrow's leaders. Communication, teamwork and problem solving capabilities are essential requirements for employers and are developed through this programme. We believe that every student has the potential to be a leader and this plays an integral part to our success. Student leadership allows students to give something back to the Academy by supporting staff and modelling our values for other students

Prefects

In years 10 and 11 students are given the opportunity to become prefects. Students complete a written application which allows them to share and celebrate their qualities. Prefects are our role models and demonstrate how to meet our high expectations. They assist with whole school events, theme days and community events. Being a prefect gives students the opportunity to build confidence, communication, independence, problem solving, organisation and much more. In addition they have the opportunity to complete a leadership award that recognises this development. All prefects receive a unique tie different to other students that allows them to stand out. Prefects in year 11 have the opportunity to apply for the prestigious role of Head Prefect or Deputy Head Prefect

Guardian Angels

The Guardian Angels are students who are trained to support and mentor our Year 7 peers, taking on a role of responsibility within the school community. This program encourages active student participation and promotes a supportive environment where older students help and guide their younger classmates. They attend form once a week to plan activities to deliver with their form group and build relationships. They are a young voice to speak to if they have any concerns. For the leaders, it's an opportunity to gain a sense of responsibility and foster a positive and supportive environment for students.

Sports Leaders

Sports leaders learn and demonstrate important life skills such as effective communication and organisation whilst learning to lead basic physical activities to younger pupils, their peers or within the community. MCA sports leaders are the driving force behind increasing physical activity during

extra-curricular time and offering students the opportunity to participate in a wide variety of sporting avenues such as involvement in; Manchester School Games, Sport Relief, National School Sports Week and transition activities. In addition, students are given the opportunity to complete leadership seminars, awards and certificates to further develop their skills and competencies.

Year 7 and 8 Ambassadors

Year 7 & 8 Ambassadors have the opportunity to develop leadership skills through form time activities which will allow the students to engage with their peers. Being an ambassador is a fantastic opportunity to gain confidence and new skills such as; resilience, communication and organisation. Ambassadors will be provided with the opportunity to represent their peers' views to help ensure student voice is at the heart of what we do at MCA.

Student Council and Anti-Bullying Ambassadors

The school council is a vehicle to give students a voice in how to shape the school for the future. The council meet with the senior leaders in the school to feedback on the curriculum, the environment and opportunities for our young people. The council have now teamed up with the Anti-Bullying ambassadors and we work towards achieving recognised awards for the school. These badges are awarded by the Diana Award and encourage students to be creative in making the school a safer and better place for all. Both the student council and Anti-bullying ambassadors work simultaneously to create, shape and build a happier environment for future generations.

An instrumental part of Key Stage 4 sees all students have a number of encounters with further and higher education institutions. In addition, all students receive one-to-one impartial careers advice interviews that involves the creation of a personalised action plan centred around their potential careers and pathways. Students are given outstanding support from our progress leaders, careers team and partner organisations based on their individual needs and interests, which readily supports the application process for either their further education or apprenticeship choices.


