

- Getting In - Qualification requirements at GCSE, A Level and Degrees.
- Prospects - Average salary, top industries recruiting and earning projections over the years depending on level on qualification.
- Personal Statement - Support writing a personal statement if wishing to have this career.

TALK WITH YOUR CHILD:

Your child liking particular careers will flag on your log in so you can see areas of interest they have. Follow up with this by having conversations with your child about this and ensuring from a young age they are working towards the skills to have success in that area and more to keep their options open. Engage in MCA's ESA's (after school clubs) helps to build all of these skills together. In Year 11 your child will have a write a personal statement about themselves... what will feature on theirs?
