WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE MOMENT?



YEAR 7

Year 7 students are currently exploring Physical Theatre in Drama, creating imaginative movement-based stories inspired by the book, Jeremiah and the Dark Woods.

YEAR 8

In Year 8, students are exploring the musical, Little Shop of Horrors, studying the play and bringing key scenes to life through performance and character work.



YEAR 9

Developing their Physical Theatre skills is also the focus for our Year 9 students at the moment. They are using a stimulus to devise their own original performances without a script or set text.

YEAR 10

Year 10 students are exploring the stage adaptation of Noughts and Crosses, developing their understanding of their chosen set text in preparation for their Drama exam.





YEAR 11

Our Year 11 students have begun Component 3 of their GCSE Drama, Exploring Scripted Performance, working in groups to rehearse and perform play extracts for assessment by an external examiner.



STAFF SPOTLIGHT

Mr Gavin teaches Drama and is the Lead of Equality, Diversity and Inclusion at MCA.

He is currently reading **Frankie** by Graham Norton. The novel follows 84-year-old Frankie Howe as she recounts her extraordinary life—from her childhood in Ireland through vibrant decades in London and 1960s New York—exploring friendship, love and resilience across time. FAMILY FOCUS

We encourage parents to support Drama learning at home by helping students practise simple but effective performance skills. One great activity is practising facial expressions in the mirror, as this helps students become more aware of how emotions can be communicated clearly to an audience. Exploring different feelings such as happiness, fear, anger or surprise builds confidence, expression and performance skills, all of which are essential in Drama lessons and assessments.



BOOKS WE'RE LOVING THIS WEEK
